Homework Hints:

To help ensure your child finds success with homework, there are many things you can do to help! In addition to modeling getting your own work done in a timely fashion and modeling organization, you can help children in many other ways such as...

Allowing your child to re-energize themselves after school by taking a break, having a snack, or playing a game before beginning homework.

Creating a routine for homework each night using the same time and place each day. Encouraging children to use planners to stay organized with assignments.

Having a set place for homework like a big desk with all necessary materials available such as pencils, paper, books, and calculators; making sure the area is free of distractions.

Sometimes a break may help with concentration during homework time.

Internet Safety/Cyber-bullying:

There are many ways you can help keep your child safe when using the internet, including...

Discussing internet safety with your child.

Monitoring your child's internet activity by making sure they use a computer that is in a common area such as a family room rather than a child's bedroom.

Reminding your child to never share personal information (name, address, phone number, school, etc.) with anyone on the internet and never to agree to meet anyone on the internet.

Not allowing your child to enter private chat rooms.
